Graham Taylor Professor Emeritus - Trent University

Graham Taylor was born in Lexington, Virginia in 1944. He received his B.A. in 1966 and Ph.D. in History in 1972, both from the University of Pennsylvania.

In 1972 he immigrated to Canada, and taught American history and Canadian-American relations at Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Trent University in Peterborough, Ontario. He was Dean of Arts and Social Sciences at Dalhousie University from 1993 to 1998, and Vice President (Academic) and Provost at Trent University from 1998 to 2003. In 2012 he retired and was appointed Professor Emeritus at Trent University.

He has published widely in the fields of Canadian business history and international business history. His books include:
